Cleveland Browns (0-4) at Buffalo Bills (1-3)

DATE: Sunday, October 11, 2009 **SITE:** Ralph Wilson Stadium

THE GAME

The Browns (0-4) look for their first win when they travel to Ralph Wilson Stadium to face the Buffalo Bills (1-3) on Sunday, October 11 at 1:00 p.m.. The contest will be the first of back-to-back road games for the Browns and the third of four in a span of five weeks. The game will be televised on CBS (WOIO-TV 19) and will air on the Browns' Flagship Station, WMMS (100.7 FM) and WTAM (1100 AM), as well as a network of affiliates throughout Ohio.

Sunday's contest will mark the third consecutive year in which the teams have faced one another in the regular season. Cleveland claimed a 29-27 victory on Monday Night Football at Ralph Wilson Stadium on November 17, 2008 and an 8-0 win in near white-out conditions, freezing temperatures and heavy winds on December 12, 2007 at Cleveland Browns Stadium. The Browns hold a 9-5 edge in the all-time regular season series and a 4-2 record at Ralph Wilson Stadium.

Last week, the Browns battled back from a 14-0 deficit, but fell 23-20 in overtime to the Cincinnati Bengals at Cleveland Browns Stadium. Cleveland used special teams plays to help mount the come back and force overtime. Defensive lineman **Shaun Rogers** blocked a first quarter field goal and an extra point attempt with 1:55 remaining in regulation to keep the score at 20-20. Cleveland also forced a fumble on kickoff coverage and used lengthy returns by wide receiver **Joshua Cribbs** to set up field position.

Offensively, running back **Jerome Harrison** recorded his first career 100-yard rushing game, as he ran for 121 yards

on 29 carries. Rookie wide receiver **Mohamed Massaquoi** caught eight passes for 148 yards, his first career 100-yard receiving game. His 148 receiving yards ranked as the second-most by a Browns rookie since the merger of the AAFC and NFL in 1950. Quarterback **Derek Anderson** recorded a rushing and passing touchdown, tying a career-best with 48 passing attempts.

Defensively, the Browns held the Bengals to eight consecutive possessions without a first down, including not allowing a first down in the second and third quarters. Cleveland limited Cincinnati to 21 yards in the second quarter and six yards in the third frame.

THE COACHES

CLEVELAND BROWNS - ERIC MANGINI



Eric Mangini is entering his first year as head coach for the Browns. For Mangini, it marked a return to his NFL roots, having kicked off his tenure in the league as a ball boy and an intern in the Browns' public relations department in 1994. His tireless work ethic was just as evident in that first year as it is today, a quality that led then-head coach Bill Belichick to add Mangini to the team's coaching staff in 1995. In his 14 years of NFL coaching experience, Mangini has been a part of six teams that qualified for the playoffs, including five that captured division crowns and three that came away with the Lombardi Trophy as Super Bowl champions. Prior to being hired by the Browns, Mangini was the head coach of the New York Jets (2006-08). In 2006, Mangini took over a team that had gone 4-12 the previous year and guided them to a record of 10-6 and a Wild Card playoff berth. The Jets started with a 5-5 mark before compiling victories in five of their last six contests, including their final three. Prior to joining the Jets, Mangini spent six seasons with the New England Patriots (2000-05). His first five seasons were spent as defensive backs coach (2000-04) before being promoted to defensive coordinator in 2005. In Mangini's five seasons in charge of the team's secondary, the unit earned five Pro Bowl selections and evolved into one of the NFL's most successful defensive backfields. Mangini's first coaching opportunity came in 1995 as an assistant on the Browns' staff. Ted Marchibroda retained Mangini when the team moved to Baltimore in 1996 and became the Ravens. Mangini was an assistant coach with the Jets under head coach Bill Parcells from 1997-99.

BUFFALO BILLS - DICK JAURON



Dick Jauron's coaching career traveled full-circle when he was named the Buffalo Bills' 14th head coach on January 23, 2006. Jauron began his coaching career as a Bills defensive assistant coach in 1985 and 21 years later he returned to Western New York to take over the team that gave him his first professional coaching job. Jauron is in his fourth season as the Buffalo Bills head coach, which is the longest tenure for a Bills head coach since Marv Levy coached the team for 12 seasons from 1986-97. Jauron has over two decades of NFL coaching experience. Jauron came to Buffalo after serving as defensive coordinator/interim head coach for the Detroit Lions from 2004-05. In his first stint as an NFL head coach, Jauron spent five seasons as the head coach for the Chicago Bears and he was the 2001 Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year. That season, he led the Bears to a 13-3 record and their first NFC Central Division Championship since 1990. Prior to his stint in Chicago, Jauron served as the defensive coordinator for the expansion Jacksonville Jaguars from 1995-98, helping lead the team to three playoff appearances in four years, including the AFC Championship game in 1996 and the AFC Central Division title in 1998. Jauron coached the defensive backs for the Green Bay Packers from 1986-94.

ABOUT THE BILLS

The Bills fell 38-10 at Miami last Sunday to drop to 1-3 on the season. Buffalo has dropped back-to-back games following a 33-20 win against Tampa Bay on September 20. Running back Fred Jackson leads the Bills in rushing yards with 333 and receiving yards with 160 on 18 receptions. Five players have accumulated 100 or more receiving yards for the Bills as Jackson, wide receiver Terrell Owens (158), wide receiver Lee Evans (148), wide receiver Josh Reed (109) and tight end Derek Schouman (103) have each reached the mark. Quarterback Trent Edwards is 70-of-117 passing for 790 yards with five touchdowns and five interceptions. Despite outscoring their opponents 24-7 in the first quarter, the Bills have been outscored 110-74 on the season.

ON DECK

The Browns travel to Pittsburgh next weekend to square-off with the Steelers on Sunday, October 18 at 1:00 p.m. The contest will mark the fourth road game in a span of five weeks for Cleveland. Pittsburgh has faced Cleveland more times than any opponent with 112 regular season matchups. The Steelers hold a 57-55 advantage in the all-time regular season series. Pittsburgh is currently on an 11 game win streak against the Browns and have claimed 17 of the last 18 meetings. The Steelers own a 35-21 edge all-time in Pittsburgh. The Browns last win against Pittsburgh was a 33-13 victory at Heinz Field on October 5, 2003.

The Browns jumped out to an early 13-0 first quarter lead after three interceptions that resulted in kicker Phil Dawson field goals of 40 and 33 yards, and a Joshua Cribbs two-yard touchdown run. The Bills responded with the next 10 consecutive points to close the gap to 13-10 at the half. After trading field goals in the third stanza, Browns running back Jerome Harrison burst open for a career-long 72 yard touchdown run, the first of his career, on the first play of the fourth quarter to give the Browns a 23-13 lead. However, on the ensuing play, Bills kick returner Leodis McKelvin took the kickoff 98-yards for a touchdown to cut the deficit to three points, 23-20. The Browns responded with a Dawson 22-yard field goal to open a 26-20 lead, however Bills quarterback Trent Edwards gave the Buffalo their only lead of the night with a one-yard touchdown run with 2:25 remaining in regulation to open a 27-26 lead. Dawson followed with his fifth field goal of the evening on a career-long 56 yarder to give the Browns the 29-27 lead with 1:39 seconds remaining. The Bills mounted one last attempt as kicker Rian Lindell's 47-yard attempt sailed wide right for the Browns to hold on for the narrow victory. In the contest, Quinn earned his first victory as a starting quarterback and was 14-of-36 passing for 185 yards. Offensively, the Browns rushed for a season-high 161 yards as Harrison rushed for a career-high 80 yards on three carries. Defensively, the Browns forced four turnovers.

CAREER VS. BUFFALO

In 14 regular season games against the Bills, the Browns have recorded five 100-yard rushing performances, two 100-yard receiving games and one 300-yard passer. Below are notable individual players' career numbers against Buffalo:

In three career games against the Bills, running back **Jamal Lewis** has rushed for 297 yards, including a 163 yard effort on December 16, 2007. He has two receptions for 23 yards. Lewis is 3-0 all-time against Buffalo.

Running back **Jerome Harrison** rushed for a then career-high 80 yards last season at Ralph Wilson Stadium on November 17. He recorded his first career rushing touchdown, a 72-yarder, in the fourth quarter to help Cleveland earn a 29-27 victory.

Quarterback **Derek Anderson** is 1-0 against Buffalo after leading the Browns to an 8-0 win on December 16, 2007. He completed 9-of-24 passes for 137 yards in blizzard like conditions.

Brady Quinn registered his first win as a starting quarterback against Buffalo last year on November 17. He finished the contest 14-of-36 for 185 yards in the come-from-behind victory.

Wide receiver **Braylon Edwards** hauled in eight passes for 104 yards last year against the Bills on November 17. In two career games against Buffalo, Edwards has totaled 168 yards on 12 receptions.

Wide receiver **Joshua Cribbs** recorded his first career rushing touchdown with a two-yard score against the Bills on November 17, 2008.

In 16 career games against the Bills, linebacker **David Bowens** has record four sacks and forced one fumble.

Defensive back **Abram Elam** recorded his first career interception and touchdown on a 92-yard return against the Bills after he picked off Trent Edwards on November 2, 2008 as a member of the Jets. He added a sack and a forced fumble later that season, when he played against Buffalo on December 14.

Bills quarterback Trent Edwards also accounted for linebacker **Kameion Wimbley's** first career interception on November 17, 2008.

Defensive back **Brandon McDonald** intercepted a Trent Edwards pass and forced a fumble when the teams met last season on November 17.

Linebacker **Eric Barton** turned in a two sack performance against the Bills on October 6, 2002 as a member of the Raiders.

In three career games against the Bills, kicker **Phil Dawson** is 7-of-8 on field goal attempts and 3-of-3 on PATs. He connected on five field goals, including a career-long game-winning 56-yarder at Ralph Wilson Stadium on November 17, 2008. He also connected on memorable 35 and 49-yard field goals in near white-out conditions, freezing temperatures and heavy winds in an 8-0 Browns win on December 16, 2007 at Cleveland Browns Stadium.

DID YOU KNOW?

Despite having played there just six times, Buffalo's Ralph Wilson Stadium ranks in a tie for the most wins by the Browns in any current NFL Stadium other than Cleveland Browns Stadium. Cleveland has four wins at Ralph Wilson Stadium, which is tied with Cincinnati's Paul Brown Stadium, San Diego's Qualcomm Stadium and Giants Stadium.

COACHES CORNER: Bills Assistant Head Coach/Special Teams Coach **Bobby April** was the special teams coordinator for the Saints in 1996 when Browns Quarterbacks Coach **Carl Smith** was the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.

Browns Assistant Head Coach/Special Teams Coordinator **Brad Seely** (1995-98) led the special teams units for the Carolina Panthers while Bills Defensive Backs Coach **George Catavolos** (1995-97) held the same position for the team. The two also coached together with the Indianapolis Colts from 1989-93.

Bills Head Coach **Dick Jauron** was the defensive coordinator in 1995 for the Jacksonville Jaguars when Browns Strength and Conditioning coach **Tom Myslinski** played on the offensive line. Bills Defensive Backs coach **George Catavolos** was the assistant head coach/defensive backs coach for the Indianapolis Colts when **Myslinski** played on the offensive line in 1998.

COACH/PLAYER CONNECTIONS: Bills Assistant Offensive Line Coach **Ray Brown** (2004-05) and Browns TE **Robert Royal** (2002-05) played together for the Washington Redskins. He is now tied with Don Cockroft and trails Lou Groza's 234 for the top spot. Earlier this season, Dawson connected on a 37-yard field goal in the opening drive against Minnesota (9/13) to bring his career total to 900 points. Dawson's 911 career points ranks third on the Browns career scoring list. Dawson, the longest tenured member of the Browns, ranks third in career field goals in Cleveland history. His 83.1% career field-goal percentage ranks seventh all-time in NFL history and first in Browns history.

KICKING IT WITH CUNDIFF

Kicker **Billy Cundiff's** 29-yard field goal in the fourth quarter at Baltimore (9/27) was his first since he converted on a 24-yard field goal at Carolina on December 24, 2005 as a member of the Dallas Cowboys. With Cundiff's field goal, he became the first kicker other than **Phil Dawson** to connect on a field goal for the Browns in the regular season since **Brett Conway** converted on an 18-yard field goal in the fourth quarter of a 22-14 Cleveland win at Cincinnati in the 2003 season finale on December 28. Dawson missed the final three games of the 2003 season with a fractured left arm and missed last week's contest with an injured right calf.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR...

The Browns haven't played back-to-back overtime games since the 2002 season. The team has played six back-to-back overtime games in franchise history, including postseason play.

LB Eric Barton...Has appeared in 88 consecutive games dating back to the 2003 season... Needs 10 more games played to reach 150.

WR/KR Joshua Cribbs...Is one return touchdown shy of taking sole possession as the Browns' all-time leader in kick return scores. He is currently tied with Eric Metcalf with seven... Needs 31 kickoff return yards for 6,000 in his career and 134 punt return yards for 1,000.

K Phil Dawson...Needs one field goal to take sole possession of second place on the Browns' all-time field goal list. He is currently tied with Dan Cockroft with 216.

WR Braylon Edwards...Has started 37 consecutive games... With 11 career 100-yard receiving games he is tied with Gary Collins for fourth on the team's all-time chart. With one, he would equal Paul Warfield (12) for third.... Needs 338 receiving yards for 4,000 in his career.

WR Mike Furrey...Needs 265 receiving yards for 2,500 in his career and needs 39 receptions for 250.

RB Jerome Harrison...With a 100-yard rushing game against the Bills he would become the first Browns player to record back-to-back 100-yard rushing games since Jamal Lewis rushed for 118 yards at the N.Y. Jets on December 9, 2007 and for 163 yards against the Bills the following week on December 16.

TE Steve Heiden...Needs two receptions for 200 in his career and 342 receiving yards to reach 2,000 career yards.

WR Mohamed Massaquoi...With a 100-yard receiving game against the Bills he would become the first Browns player to record back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since Braylon Edwards recorded 110 receiving yards at Cincinnati on September 17, 2006 and turned in 116 yards against Baltimore the following week on September 24.

RB Jamal Lewis...Needs 72 rushing yards to pass Ottis Anderson (10,273) for 23rd on the NFL career rushing list... Needs 76 rushing attempts for 2,500 in his career and 154 receiving yards for 2,000.

QB Brady Quinn...Needs 37 passing yards for 1,000 in his career.

TE Robert Royal...Needs 326 receiving yards for 1,500 in his career.

OL Joe Thomas...Has started all 36 career games at left tackle since joining the Browns in 2007.

LB Kamerion Wimbley...Has recorded a sack in back-to-back games, with another against the Bills it would mark the third time in his career that he has registered a sack in three consecutive contests... Has started 51 consecutive games for the Browns.

CARRYING THE LOAD

Since 2007, the Browns are 11-3 in games when running back **Jamal Lewis** has 20 or more carries. In his career, Lewis has helped power his team's to a 51-13 record when he reaches the 20 attempt mark. In addition, the Browns are 5-0 when Lewis goes over 100 yards rushing. In his 35 career 100-yard games, Lewis' teams are 28-7.

(On the Cincinnati game) - "I couldn't be prouder of how they played and competed through five quarters. I thought that there were some great individual efforts, as well as some great collective efforts. Shaun Rogers blocking a field goal, blocking the PAT there late. (Mohamed) Massaquoi, the things he was able to do offensively. I'm not sure how many yards he had, but it was well over 100. Jerome Harrison, guys like Mike Furrey, playing some on defense. There were just a lot of really good individual efforts. It's difficult to lose at any point. It's always difficult to lose one like this when it went as long as it did, they fought as hard as they did and to come out on the minus side of the ledger. I think the thing that you see is that there are a lot of things here to build on from this experience. Offensively, we were able to move the ball, able to run the ball. Defensively, there was improvement on third down. Some of the other things that we were able to do with packages, I think all good things. I haven't even mentioned Josh Cribbs and the day that he had. Talk about a guy that wills the return to happen and the way that the group blocked. Tough for the group, but I couldn't be prouder of the way they played and that's what I told them."

(On Jerome Harrison's performance against the Bengals) - "I thought he did a nice job last week and then to get the volume of carries that he had this week. (Chris) Jennings might have had one or two in there. I thought he did pretty good from coming up from the practice squad. I give credit to the offensive line, too. There were some guys filling in and doing well. That's a group effort. The tight ends, Lawrence (Vickers), I thought all of them, all together, did a nice job and really, the receivers too. You lose track of those guys. There were some blocks that they made that helped spring some runs that probably wouldn't have been there."

(On what the team was able to do in the second half against Cincinnati that they were not able to do in the previous three games) - "I think it was the complementary football. I think more so than anything our ability offensively to generate drives, and generate long drives. I think we only had three or six plays defensively in that third quarter, and also, our ability to get off the field on third down defensively. The defensive line, I thought did a nice job in their third down pass rush. That coordinated defense, the coverage held up. That's a good group. They have a good group of receivers, a really good quarterback. Our guys filled in where they needed to fill in. You saw Mike Adams playing a couple different roles. Mike Furrey out there playing safety, playing star, and that's sometimes what you have to do, is just figure out how you can help. Figure out the best combination and play good coordinated offensive and defensive football and good things usually happen."

(On Derek Anderson's play against the Bengals) - "I thought he played well. You don't want turnovers and he was very conscious of that throughout the week. It's something he's continued to work at. He made a lot of nice throws. I thought he made a lot of nice checks. There were some times where the clock was getting a little bit tight and he got guys in the right spots. I thought he ran the offense well, which is very important. I also thought he threw the ball pretty well today also."

(On what he is trying to achieve with the Browns) - "It's a process of building the organization for the long term and getting better in each phase organizationally for the long term, whether it's coaching, whether it's player acquisition, whether it's salary cap, whether it's operations, video. There are all different components that go to building a successful organization. Those are all things that you keep working at, the composition of the team, all those things. Doing it in New York, you keep working and improving and evaluating. It takes time and you have to be consistent with it. You have to work at it every day. As you do, you continually get better. I saw it in New England as well. You work at it, you work at it,

you work at it and you're consistent with it and committed to it and good things happen."

(On what a major position change could do to the locker room) - "I think the important thing is to always explain what the end goal is, and that's something that I've done and will continue to do. The goal is really to put the best group on that we can and to make decisions that will help us win the game. There's nothing more to it than that. We're all striving to be the best at our positions and all the players are trying to be starters. Really, what would be a concern is if there was a change made and the guy that the change was made with wasn't competitive about it. You'd like a locker room full of guys that each week they're trying to get to the game, they're trying to move up on the practice squad, they're trying to get better at their positions. The important thing is communicating it out and everybody understanding what the goal is."

(On if he has the players needed to win) - "Yes, there are plenty of players in there that we can win. The way that we need to do it is by addressing the problems that we have. It's not some big mystery. It's things that are correctable, controllable. We just didn't control them."

(On how he prevents players from having a discouraged attitude because of last year) - "Last year has nothing to do with this year. Next year will have nothing to do with this year, either. What we control is right now, with this group of guys, by the way we work, by the way we respond, by the way we prepare. That is what affects this year. That is what affects right now. It is consistently going to be emphasized, because it is right. Last year has no affect on this year and five years ago, that doesn't either. It's right now, this moment, this group, how we work, how we prepare and then how we execute on Sunday."

(On Jamal Lewis) - "Jamal is a guy that you know over the years from watching him play, but you don't know the guy until you actually work with him. He's that term that I use to describe guys that take their job very seriously and approach it the same way every day, that are consistent. He's a pro. What I've liked about him, too, is, and this is another characteristic of guys that are pros, is they work with the young guys. He's always open to answering questions, whether it's for Jerome (Harrison), or James Davis, or Vick (Lawrence Vickers) or anybody else. Sometimes the questions aren't just running back based. It could be, what's your recovery routine? How do you watch tape? The older guys, the guys with experience, can really help a team by sharing the things they've learned, hopefully preventing some of the mistakes they made as young guys. You're always looking for that as a coach."

(On Eric Barton) - "One of the things that Eric does really well is identify what the opponent's doing. He does a good job with the defense, in terms of trying to communicate out all the adjustments. There have been some plays I thought he's done really well. He's pretty self-critical and he's pretty self-aware, in terms of where his weakness were, where he hasn't played well and he's the type of guy that corrects it. He is very, very smart, intuitive, all those things."

(On what Shaun Rogers means to the team) - "He's an outstanding player. He has very good strength against the run. He has very good awareness of blocking schemes. He has a high motor when he plays. That's sometimes tough to do when you're a bigger guy, to go play in and play out at a high level. You're carrying a little bit more luggage than some of the little guys. I think he's also a very effective pass rusher. He has a lot of great traits."

OB Derek Anderson

(On the confidence level of the team) - "In general, we're good. I don't think anybody in the room is going to question anything. Everybody is going to go out there and play hard. I've been with most of these guys for five years now and it has been the same way regardless of what the situation was that we were in. Everybody went in, studied, prepared, always gave their best, and that's all you can ask from guys in the locker room."

(On the receiving unit against Cincinnati) - "Once we get him (Massaquoi) and Braylon going at the same time I think that we can do a lot of different things. I think the confidence of everybody out there was, I could feel it and guys started feeling how it was supposed to go. We were moving the ball when we wanted to but we just didn't get the points when we needed them."

(On starting after losing the quarterback battle) - "I don't think my frame of mind ever went by the wayside. I felt like I had a good training camp and did some good things. So I was confident, like I always am, in my own abilities and I when I get in there, I try to be positive and give the guys a spark and continue to do the right things."

WR Josh Cribbs

(On the team fighting back against Cincinnati) - "We're not the same team we were last year. There is no giving up. There's no going in the tank. We felt like it was challenge for us coming in at halftime down and knowing we were going to get the ball back. We felt like it was a challenge and we were up for it. Everybody was up for it and you saw the outcome. We fought to the end. I'm proud of this football team."

(On Derek Anderson's performance against Cincinnati and the energy of the team) - "I think he played solid. An alternative is always good and he proved that he can lead a football team. I'm proud of this football team. We fought until the end. In a city like this that works hard, I don't think that any other city works this hard, the blue collar workers in Cleveland expect the football team to work as hard as we did. Even though we lost, I think the fans are still proud of us."

WR Braylon Edwards

(On if he can be effective in a game without catching a pass) - "I believe so. I try and go out there and be the guy everyone focuses on. That's one of the core characteristics that Eric Mangini speaks about. That's what I am trying to be, not a distraction, but a helpful guy on this team. Mohamed Massaquoi, what can you say, he made the plays that came to him. He performed well, he has been getting better each week and having more confidence each week and it showed today. He had a superb game."

(On how the team played against Cincinnati) - "I think it's two factors. I think one, Coach Mangini as he came in this week had a different approach. What I mean by that, it wasn't really much different, but he just showed us that there's so much season left. You guys have so much fight, so much talent. He just had a different, I don't know, feel about him. I really don't know how to

explain it. He had a different feel. I believe we ran with that and we worked hard for him this week. Coming into the locker room, I think we as players knew that we spotted them those 14 points. On offense, we give up the fumble that goes back for the touchdown. If we don't do that it's 7-0. We knew that we were in it with them. Defense was doing a good job. We were getting some movement on offense. We can come back out here and we can continue to do the things we were doing and tighten up some of the areas and we can make some plays."

RB Jerome Harrison

(On the game against Cincinnati) - "It's real difficult. It was a tough loss. The guys fought hard. Especially when you play that long and that hard, and the ball doesn't fall your way, it's especially hard. I'd go to war with the guys in this locker room any day of the week. The guys in this locker room are very dedicated to each other, as well as the coaches. We're going to build on this. We're not going to let anything take us backwards."

(On the team playing well despite being counted out) - "The world isn't in here. It's these players in uniforms and the people in the organization, they are all that really matter. It's about the people that support us in good times and bad."

LB D'Qwell Jackson

(On the level of passion the team is showing) - "It shows the character of the guys on this locker room. You can't tell on Sunday's but you look around, guys are not hanging their heads. Guys want to win. Guys are doing whatever it takes to get that edge. That's what we need. At this point, we're the guys in this locker room that believe we can get it done."

RB Jamal Lewis

Running back Adrian Peterson rushed for 180 yards and three touchdowns as the Vikings downed the Browns 34-20 at Cleveland Browns Stadium. After a failed onside kick to open the game, the Browns took the opening possession 31 yards and kicker Phil Dawson connected on a 37-yard field goal to give Cleveland the early advantage. The Vikings added a first quarter field goal and Peterson scored a one-yard touchdown to put Minnesota back on top. A 20-yard Dawson field goal and a 67-yard punt return for a touchdown by Joshua Cribbs gave the Browns a 13-10 halftime advantage. The Browns limited Minnesota to 90 net yards in the half and held Peterson to 25 rushing yards, but The Vikings piled up 24 second half points. Peterson burst through with 155 rushing yards in the second half, including a 64-yard fourth quarter score to help put the game out of reach. Brett Favre, making his Vikings debut, was held to 110 passing yards and was sack four times.
